Week 5 | 6.21.20 | Greater Perspective | “We, Not Me”

Sermon Overview: *Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are able to see from a different perspective. When we face pain, struggle, opposition, or suffering we must remember as followers of Christ - victory is imminent, but not immediate. Suffering is immediate, but not permanent. Our greater perspective comes when we fully submit to the Spirit’s work in our lives, and He grants us the ability to see life, situations, and even people as He sees them - an opportunity for His glory to be revealed.*

And every day, in the Temple and from house to house, they continued to teach and preach this message: ‘Jesus is the Messiah.’” - Acts 5:40-41 NLT
