

Sermon Series: Greater

Week 6 | 6.28.20 | Greater Grace | “We, Not Me”

Sermon Overview: *We are wrapping up our series, Greater, with a discussion about God’s unmerited grace on and in us all. Peter, In Acts 15:11, took all distinctions and threw them out when he made the claim that we are all saved the same way - through the undeserved grace of the Lord Jesus. Our understanding of grace should inform the potency of our mission and the posture of our hearts toward those around us. There are no distinctions, we are all saved by God’s grace - no entitlement, no worthiness. Grace.*

Primary Text: *“He made no distinction between us and them, for he cleansed their hearts through faith. So why are you now challenging God by burdening the Gentile believers with a yoke that neither we nor our ancestors were able to bear? We believe that we are all saved the same way, by the undeserved grace of the Lord Jesus.” - Acts 15:9-11 NLT*

Discussion Questions

1. Have you ever put weight on someone that even you could not bear to carry?
2. In what ways do you need to replace entitlement with an understanding of God’s grace?
3. Are you a grace giver? Why or why not?
